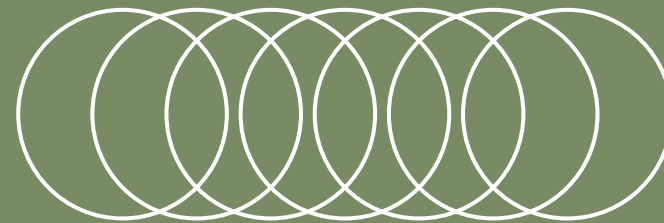

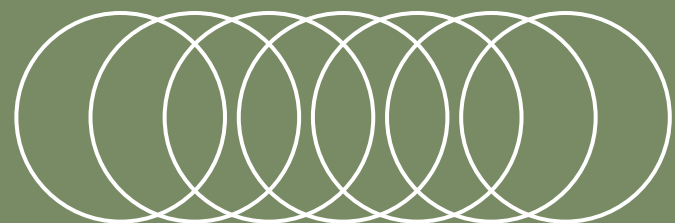

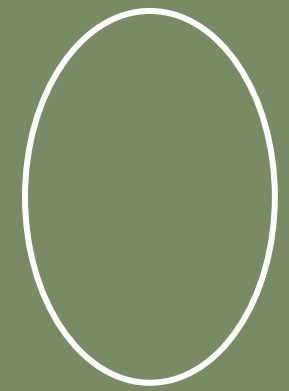




What is the Collaborative Leadership Project?

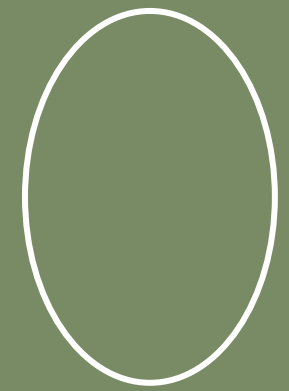
